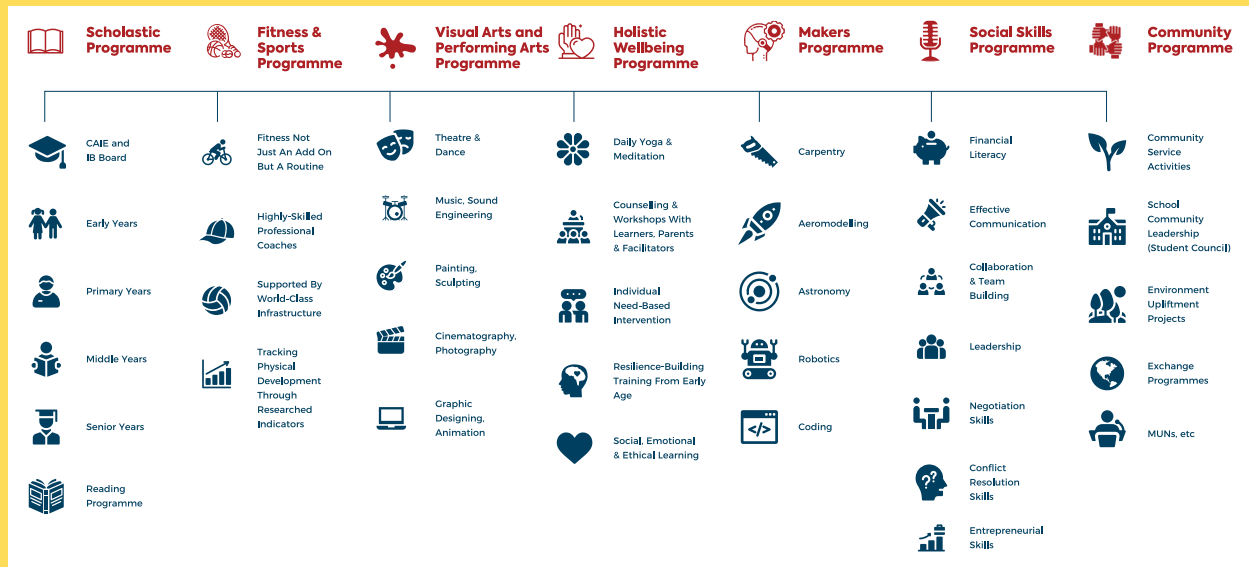

The first week involved the learners to independently choose activities from a range of events that were being conducted in school. Their choices varied from Poetry, Swimming, Canvas Painting, Fluid Art, Robotics, Etiquette Workshops, Script Writing, Adventure Sports, Music, Science Experiments, Skating, Pottery, Stand up, Hip Hop Dance, Abacus, Public Speaking, Yoga, Aero-modeling, Entrepreneurial Skill.

All the sessions were curated in alignment with the seven LEEP delivery verticals.

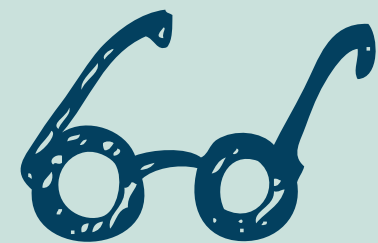


SOCIAL SKILLS PROGRAMME

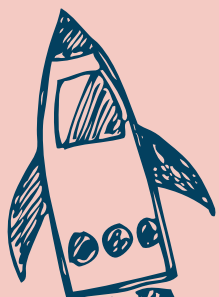


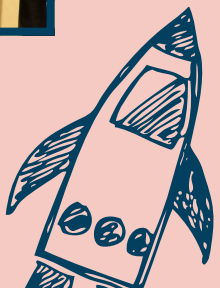


VISUAL ARTS PROGRAMME



Visual Art is an extremely important LEEP vertical and it was presented well during Learnopedia 3.0. Visual Arts helps students in bringing out creativity as well as developing the overall personality. It helps nurture fundamental thinking while improving their psychological as well as creative aptitude. Students were delighted to attend the workshop on Fluid Art and Pottery. In Fluid Art, they could explore endless possibilities in art through abstract expression, experimenting with colours on canvas. Pottery focused on developing their motor and thinking skills.

FITNESS & SPORTS PROGRAMME

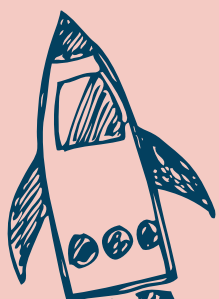

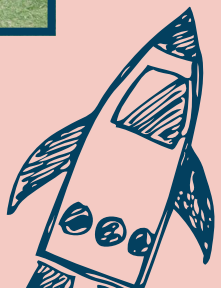


MAKERS PROGRAMME



The different activities in the Makers vertical were geared towards developing reasoning skills. It served as an active learning platform for various scientific and mathematical principles. The Wonder Lab made children wonder about the science behind various day-to-day observations. Robotics and Coding helped develop computational thinking and an algorithmic mindset. Learners analyzed the design of aircraft in aeromodelling and consequently created their own prototypes. It helped build students' visualization capabilities, nurtured curiosity, and boosted structured thinking.





HOLISTIC WELLBEING PROGRAMME

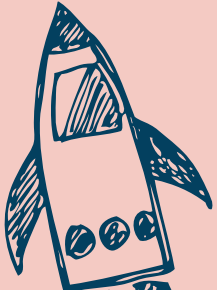

COMMUNITY PROGRAMME

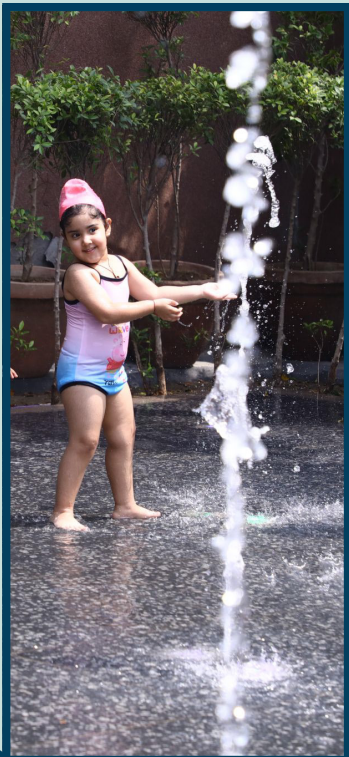

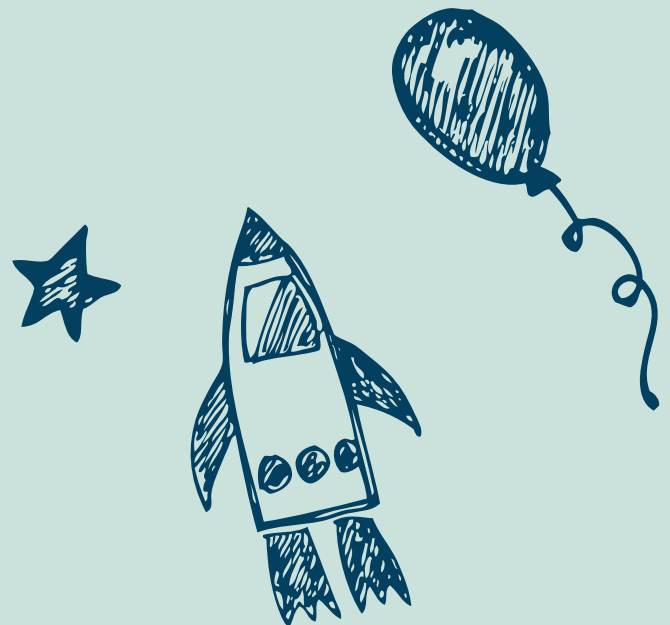

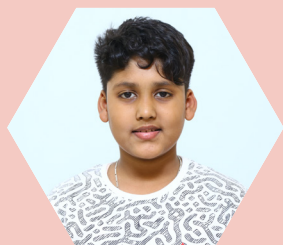
