Montessori

The youngest learners of the school engaged in activities to develop concentration, fine motor skills, a good self image, sense of responsibility, appreciate the environment and gain independence.



The learners activated their thinking skills, developed the power of observation, attention, refined their visual and tactile senses, eye hand coordination and three finger grip mechanics for writing. Learners enhanced their creative thinking skills by expressing their feelings through colours. They used their self-management skills as they displayed good body control and safely used the tools during various activities like matching Montessori colour tablets, stringing beads and seriating knobless cylinders. The learners observed that colours can change while going through different processes and new colours can be formed. It was an exciting moment for them and they enjoyed it thoroughly.







I'm Mathelete!



Visit to Beejom Farms - Outbound Learning trips strengthen learner's inquiry. Field trips involve direct and focussed reflection on their experience and application of newly developed learning to new situations. In the Unit of Inquiry 'Sharing the Planet' with 'Interdependence' as a conceptual lens, learners of grade nursery visited Beejom Farm to experience visual and tactile learning of different types of plants and delve into the importance of living beings. They saw different coloured lettuce, cabbage, tall banana trees, radish, onion, potato and carrot growing in the soil. They fed fodder to goats, cows and horses. They could identify living beings as an important part of the planet Earth.




They created a massive floral rangoli. Learners from Early years to Grade V participated enthusiastically in the activity and made it a huge success.




Integration of Art and Music
